

60 credit dissertation



- Focus on international law and its application to global environmental challenges, such as climate change, biodiversity loss and pollution control.
- Edinburgh offers a thriving network of climate and environmental researchers and postgraduate students working and studying across many disciplines.



Courses*

Compulsory courses:

- International Environmental Law (40 credits, 2 semesters)
- International Climate Change Law (20 credits)

Core courses

Select between 20 and 60 credits from the following:

- International Ocean Governance and the Protection of the Marine Environment (20 credits)

- New Perspectives on International Law and the Environment (20 credits)
- Energy Transition and the International Economic Legal Order: Governance, Challenges and Innovation (20 credits)
- The Law of Carbon Management: Regulating Carbon Dioxide Removals and CCS (20 credits)

Option to select between 0 and 40 credits from the following:

- Global Environment: Key Issues (20 credits)

Law School optional courses


You will have the option to take between 0 and 40 credits of the following courses from different subject areas offered by the Law School, depending on availability and with the express permission of the programme director.


Dissertation (60 credits)

- Approved topic in the field of Global Environment and Climate Change Law
- 10,000 words
- Written between April-August
- Structured supervision to support your independent scholarly research
- An excellent foundation for doctoral research



How you will learn

- Weekly two-hour interactive seminars per semester for each subject
- Active participation in discussions and advance reading expected
- Classes may also involve lectures, class debates, individual presentations, or group exercises for example.
- No exams
- Courses use a range of take-home assessments (e.g. essays, reports) or in-class work (oral presentations, class participation).
