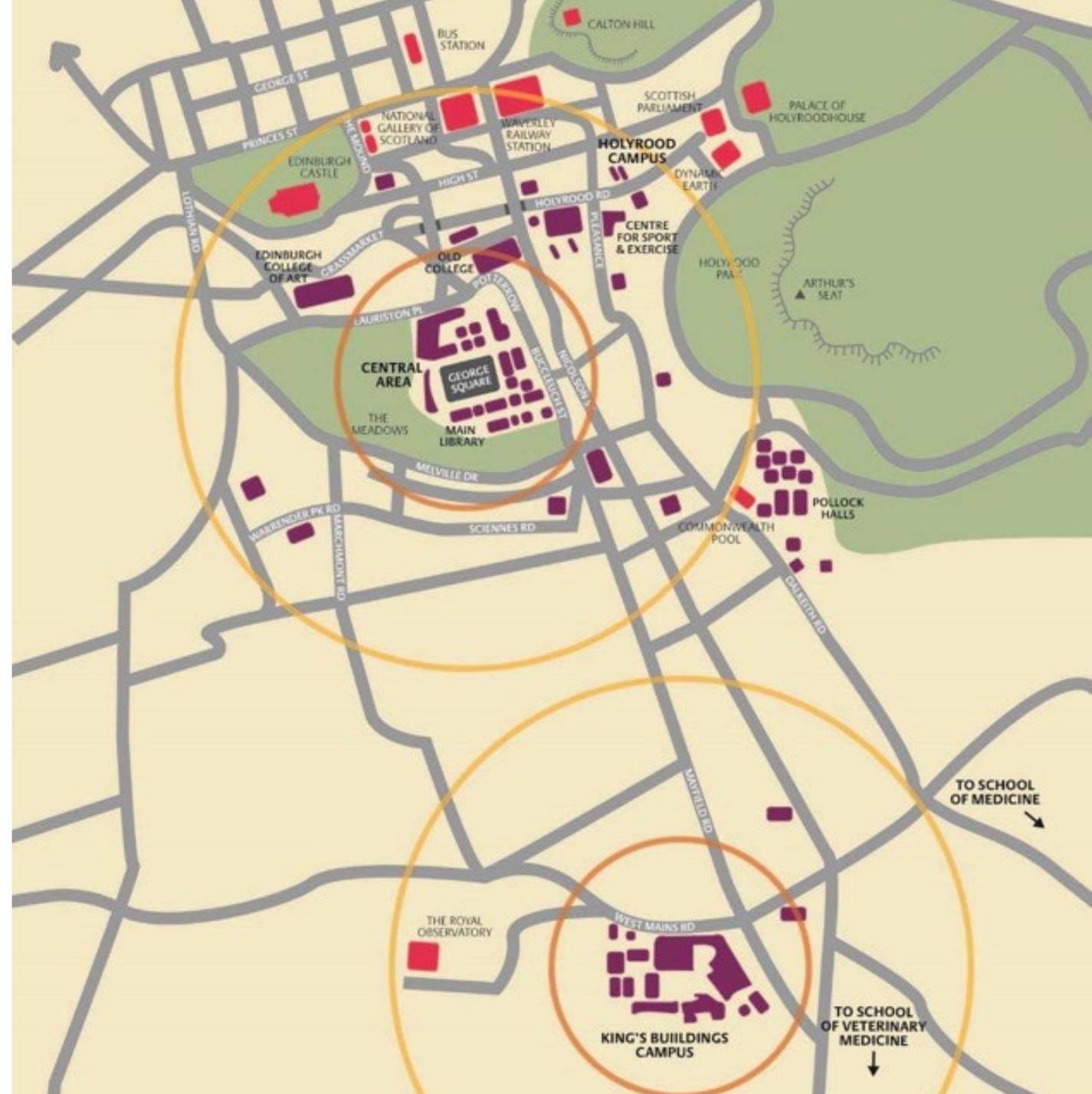
■ = University buildings

○ = 5-minute walk

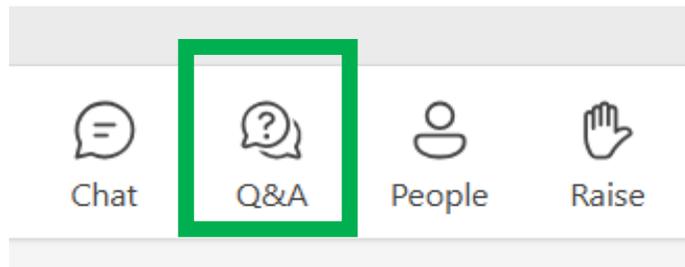

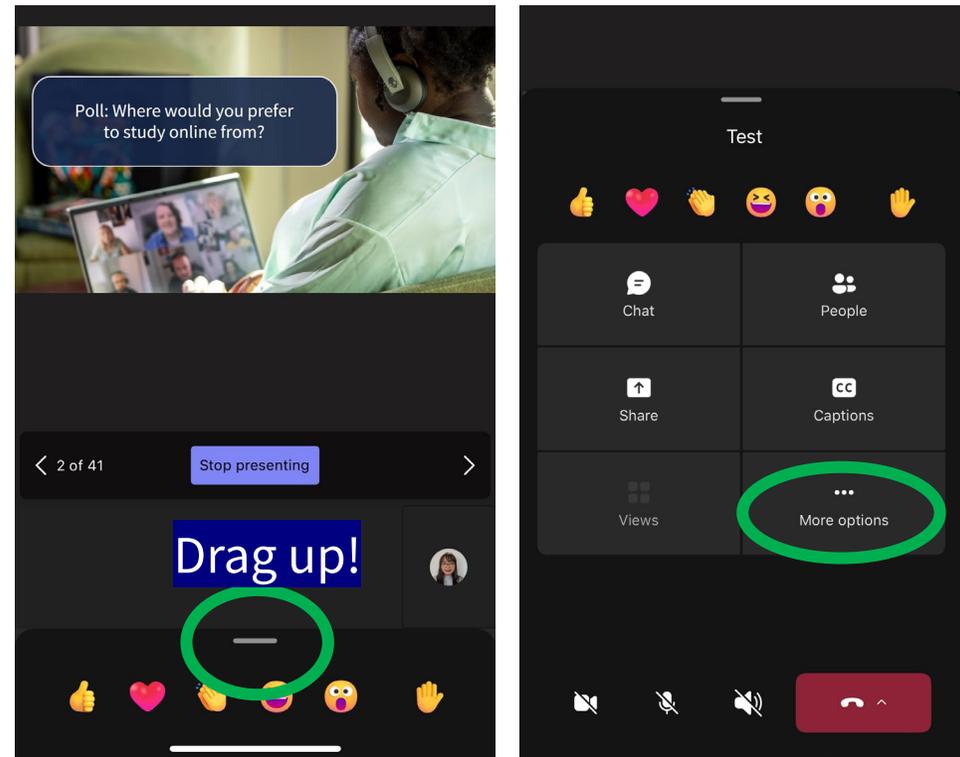

# Postgraduate degrees

Taught degrees, 12 months full time\*\* most programmes

MA, MSc, MBA, MEd, MMus, MTheol, LLM

Curriculum driven experience, culminating in a period of independent work submitted as a dissertation



# Postgraduate degrees

## Research degrees

### **MSc by Research – 1 year**

More individual, research-driven approach to chosen subject, preparation and training for advanced PhD research

### **MPhil – 2 years**

Advanced research qualification, assessed by thesis

### **PhD – 3 years**

Highly specialised independent research training culminating in submission of thesis

# Edinburgh taught masters

Highly intensive, typically 12 months of full-time study

- Two 10-week semesters culminating in a dissertation over the summer
- Mix of core and optional courses, often including opportunity for interdisciplinary study
- Independent project or dissertation to build on your interests (typically May – August)
- PG Certificate/Diplomas - a vocational programme to build your skillset
- Preparation for further research
- Stimulating and supportive postgraduate community
- Links with industry and professional networking opportunities

# Edinburgh research degrees

## Intensive period of independent research

- Develop the methodological and technical skills and subject knowledge to contribute to your discipline.
- MScR programmes provide a stepping-stone to research career or PhD study
- Manage your own or an established project with one or more supervisors who are leaders in their fields
- Embrace your academic autonomy whilst belonging to a supportive and collegiate community
- Access to cutting-edge facilities and transferable skills training

# Careers and employability

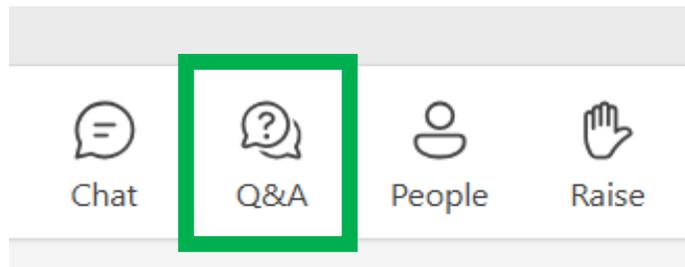
Employers from all sectors regard Edinburgh as an excellent training ground for high-flyers

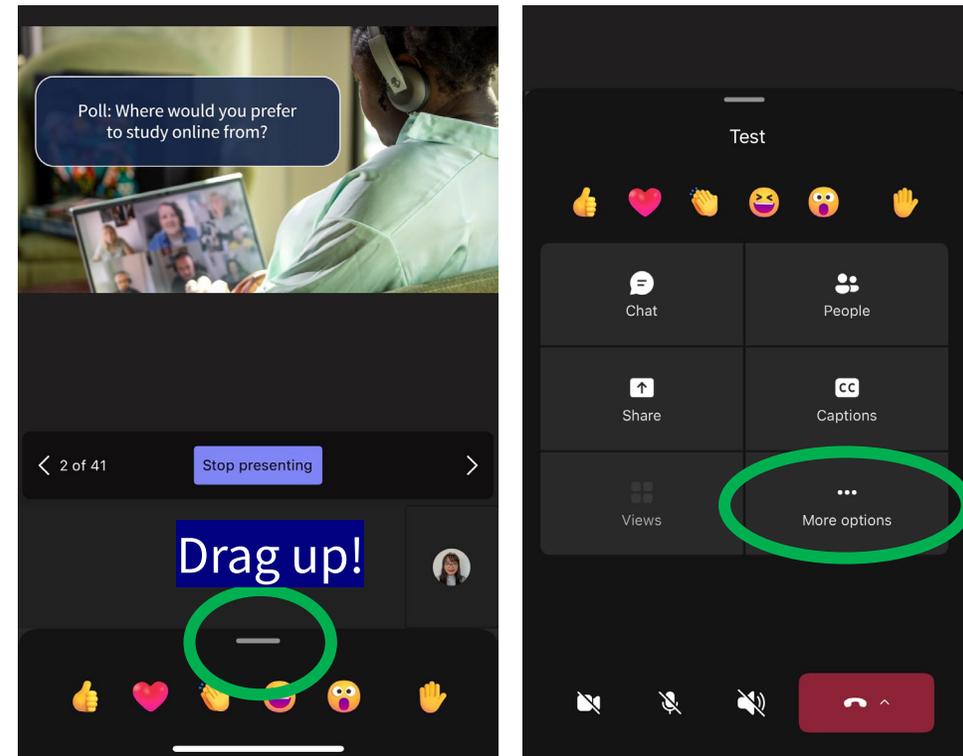

# Applying to Edinburgh

## Wide range of qualifications recognised for entry

- Accepted qualifications for entry listed for every programme in [Degree Finder](#)
- Entry is competitive, but varies between programmes
- Courses in high demand likely require higher entry grades
- Check for non-academic entry requirements such as work experience, interviews, portfolio
- Asylum & Refugee status

# How to apply

Check our degree finder for full programme and contact details

Check subject-specific entry requirements and identify funding for which you're eligible

Prepare your personal statement and request an academic reference

PhD applicants only: Identify a supervisor and prepare your research proposal

Submit application before the deadline!

# Costs and funding

Varies by programme and fee status

- Check website or up-to-date information on course fees and any additional programme costs
- Recommended budget of £1,500 per month for living costs
- Check with national funding bodies, UK student apply to local funding body for loan/grants
- Merit-based scholarships available for a limited number of programmes
- Check your options using Scholarship search tool
