



# LLM in International Economic Law

This programme is designed to provide you with an advanced knowledge and understanding of the institutions, rules and principles which underpin the contemporary international economic order.

Our aim is to provide you with:

- both a theoretical and practical understanding of the core branches of international economic law;
- a deep knowledge of the contemporary challenges facing this dynamic field.
- the critical skills required for independent analysis of international economic legal and policy issues; and the
- academic skills required to analyse the activities of international governmental and non-governmental organisations and private actors in the field of international economic law.




# Dissertation (60 credits)

- Approved topic in the field of International Economic Law
- 10,000 words
- Written between April-August
- Structured supervision to support your independent scholarly research
- An excellent foundation for doctoral research



# How you will learn

- Weekly two-hour interactive seminars per semester for each subject
- Active participation in discussions and advance reading expected
- Classes may also involve lectures, class debates, individual presentations, or group exercises for example.
- No exams
- Courses use a range of take-home assessments (e.g. essays, reports) or in-class work (oral presentations, class participation).
