
The University of Edinburgh and the World Bank are collaborating on a training programme to improve the way that policymakers and development agencies manage markets in health products and services.





- Student led 'desk based' major piece of independent research
 - You decide - subject, method and research question.

- Comparing family policy expansion in Germany and Japan.

- 'Placement based' dissertation
 - A project determined by external organisation
 - Application based and competitive process.


