



What is a Doctorate?



As a doctoral (PhD) candidate you will have the opportunity to pursue original research and make a significant contribution to your chosen field.

If you choose to study on one of our PhDs with Integrated Study full-time you will spend 4 years building and demonstrating your ability to do advanced, systematic research using specialised knowledge, at the frontier of business, accounting and finance.

If you choose to study on one of our Management Science & Analytics or Financial Technology PhDs, you will spend 3 years full-time or 6 years part-time pursuing independent research and developing specialised knowledge and skills.

At the end of your PhD, you will write up your findings in a thesis and submit this for an oral examination (viva voce) with an academic panel, consisting of one internal and at least one external examiner.



Our MScR Programme



Our MSc by Research in Management programme, commonly referred as the MRes, develops your ability to pursue original research in a critical and scholarly way. It may be taken either as a free-standing Masters or as the first part of a PhD programme.

It's a 12-month programme with a September start date. You'll receive 120 credits worth of in-depth training in topics such as research design and guided reading, before embarking on 60 credit dissertation.

Entry Requirements



MSc by Research in Management

Previous undergraduate degree at a 2:1 minimum.

PhD with Integrated Study in Management, Accounting or Finance

Previous Masters with an overall mark of 65% or above, distinction level dissertation. MBA or master's students without a dissertation are welcome to apply and should normally provide evidence of distinction-level work throughout their studies.

Those joining the Accounting or Finance programmes should hold their Masters in a similar quantitative or business subject. Applicants may be able to be considered without a Masters if they hold an Undergraduate degree with a First Class classification and a dissertation with a mark of 70% or more.

PhD in Financial Technology

Previous Masters with an overall mark of 70% or above, and normally a distinction dissertation in finance, economics, informatics, physics, mathematics, engineering, or other relevant programmes with significant quantitative elements. Students with significant finance and technology industry experience, or with relevant professional qualifications who have a minimum of a bachelor's degree in the relevant programmes listed above will be given due consideration on a case-by-case basis.

PhD in Business Economics or Management Science & Analytics

Previous Masters with an overall mark of 65% or above, distinction level dissertation. MBA or master's students without a dissertation are welcome to apply and should normally provide evidence of distinction-level work throughout their studies.



Entry Requirements



Applicants of every nationality are required to prove their English language competency before joining a UK graduate programme.

In Summary:

- If you are a national of a UKVI Majority English Language Country or Canada and have studied a previous degree within a UKVI Majority English Language Country this can be considered evidence.
- If you have a degree certificate from a UKVI Majority English Language Country awarded no more than 3.5 years prior to the applied programme's start date this can be considered evidence.
- If you have a degree certificate from one of the approved universities in Non-Majority English Speaking Countries awarded 3.5 years prior to the start date of the programme you are applying to, this can be considered evidence.
- Or you can provide an accepted English language certificate. The mostly commonly accepted certificates are the IELTS and TOEFL.



Your Research Proposal



Your research proposal is an essential part of your application that will be used to assess your suitability for the a research programme. It is used to assess both your suitability for a research degree and whether we can offer you specialist supervision. If you are accepted onto the programme you are not committed to follow your proposed research exactly, however, applications received without a proposal cannot be considered.

Proposals should be between 1,000 and 1,500 words in length for the MRes and PhD with Integrated Study, and between 3,000 and 5,000 words in length for the 3-year PhD programmes (excluding references or appendices) and:

- Have a title.
- Explain the particular topic or question you wish to study.
- Briefly summarise existing research on the topic, making reference to publications as appropriate.
- Give a clear outline of the research you intend to do.


Finding a Supervisor



Finding a suitable supervisor to guide you through your studies is a crucial consideration. When you submit your application if possible you should indicate your preferred supervisor(s) or at a minimum the group your research topic would be most suitable within.

We encourage all applicants to contact their preferred supervisor during the application process to ensure your topic matches their own research area and to gain feedback on the draft proposal. Epistemic Vices in Organizations: Knowledge, Truth, and Unethical Conduct

Abstract

Recognizing that truth is socially-constructed or that knowledge and power are related is fairly a novelty in the social sciences in the twenty-first century. However, there appears to be a renewed concern regarding people's relationship with the truth and the propensity for certain actions to undermine it. Organizations are highly implicated in this, given their central roles in knowledge management and production and their attempts to cover up, although the entanglement of these epistemological issues with business ethics has not been engaged as explicitly as it might be. Drawing on work from a virtue epistemology perspective, this paper outlines the idea of a set of epistemic vices permeating organizations, along with examples of unethical epistemic conduct by organizational actors. While existing organizational research has examined various epistemic vices that make people and organizations ineffective and irresponsible ones, according to this paper, it introduces 'hot epistemology', a nascent but growing subfield of virtue epistemology which, to the best of our knowledge, has yet to be explicitly developed in terms of business ethics. 
