PhD study

- * Supervised by 2-3 academics
- * Research training
- * Subject-area level research seminars
- * Carry out independent research resulting in an original contribution to knowledge
- * Submit thesis of up to 100,000 words & oral examination
- * Varied opportunities for professional development

Overview

Awards may change each year – most in SPS for PhD programmes

- * Search MSc(R) or PhD University-wide scholarships: <https://www.ed.ac.uk/student-funding/search-scholarships>
- * SPS runs annual scholarship recruitment cycles
- * Most scholarships fund 3 years FTE, some may fund 4 years FTE
- * SPS full-time PhD programmes are 3+1 years http://www.drps.ed.ac.uk/current/dpt/drps_sps.htm – tuition fees for 3 years, matriculation fee for ‘Writing Up’ year eg £210 for 2025/26
- * Applications for the PhD programme must be submitted first – receive University Username UUN (eg s1234567) & access to the scholarship application system c.5 working days later
- * Scholarship rounds are highly competitive. See scholarship webpages for stats



Guidance

- * Scholarships advertised from November 2025 for September 2026 start date - <https://www.sps.ed.ac.uk/study/prospective/postgraduate-research-programmes/scholarships>
- * Check eligibility of each scholarship & essential to read 'Important information' section before applying
- * Take your time / prepare in advance
- * Follow the guidance for each scholarship
- * Check closing dates and application process carefully – late applications are not accepted
- * Tailor your Personal Statement for the scholarship if one is requested



Guidance continued

- * Essential to contact potential supervisors before applying:

- * Applications are assessed holistically – grades matter but so do the research proposal, personal statement, supervisory fit, references
- * Interviews may be required – check the scholarship webpage
- * Re-visit the PhD Scholarships webpage from November to check for all opportunities –

Postgraduate Research on-programme support

- Masters by Research (MScR) on transition to PhD & research opportunities, & PhD students
- PGR Research Support Fund – eg presenting at conferences / workshops, undertaking fieldwork via the Student Development Office
- On-programme support – pastoral & academic (supervisors & Postgraduate Advisors), peer (PGR Reps & Subject Area & School community cohorts). PGR Support Team signposts to multiple University services, training courses, Doctoral Seminars (for MScR & PhD), policy & regulation guidance, programme support eg concessions (interruptions or extensions)
- MScR on-programme support is managed by the Student Advisors (programme and personal support) & the Postgraduate Teaching Office (taught courses management)
